(1) Served 102 businesses and activities are organized by new EDD Reporting Categories for employer services.

(2) Contacted 30 businesses and confirmed 279 layoffs (Q1-10 and Q2-269) with 13 business and provided 5 Rapid Response Orientations per business request. Layoffs by EDD industry categories were Accommodation and Food Services (93), Healthcare and Social Assistance (55), Arts Entertainment and Recreation (50), Other Services Except Public Administration (38), Retail Trade (38), and Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation (5).

(3) Connected with 32 businesses to avert layoffs related to Business Operations Improvements (20), Hiring Layoffs (8), Downsizing (2) & Business Succession Planning (2).

(4) SBDC served 20 new businesses & averted 22 layoffs, on track to meet annual goal of serving 40 new at-risk businesses & averting 60 layoffs.

(5) Employer information and support services includes Networking (46), Labor Market Information (6) & Community Resource Referrals (3).

(6) Recruitment services includes Job Listings & Candidate Referrals (30), Job Fairs at Watsonville Career Center (10), CalJOBS Assistance (6) & Job Fairs at Capitola Career Center (2).
