Item 2 - Review and Approval of 2025 CEDS Budget

The WDB Director recommended a CEDS-funded budget of \$55,000 for the 2025-2029 period, including:

- \$50,000 to contract for the development of the next CEDS Five-Year Plan.
- \$5,000 for WDB staffing support.

The recommended budget is attached. Funding ratios were apportioned to specific jurisdictions based on relative population size, as determined by the 2023 California Department of Finance.
